POSITION TITLE: Foundations Adjunct Faculty & Curriculum Developer – Fall 2017 Semester
TAACCCT IV Grant Funded

INSTITUTION: Kennebec Valley Community College (KVCC) is a 2-year comprehensive community college in the center of Maine serving approximately 2400 students from Somerset, Kennebec, and Knox counties and well beyond. In 2014, KVCC expanded its Fairfield-based operation to include a new 600-acre Harold Alfond Campus in Hinckley, Maine. Over the past three years, KVCC has invested nearly \$30 million in college programs, infrastructure, and buildings including construction of the new KVCC Center for Science and Agricultural Education, the 120-acre organic farm at KVCC (including education facility, vegetable processing center, equipment, implements, systems, soils, livestock, greenhouses, shelters, fields), a new state-of-the-art culinary arts facility and demonstration kitchen, the largest carpentry lab in the northeast, an indoor electrical lineworker training facility, two medical simulation labs, an early childhood outdoor family education lab, a CNC machine tool lab, a welding lab, and many other important updates including a vast overhaul of IT equipment, software, and computers. KVCC's new Alfond Campus and the revitalized Fairfield campus offer an unparalleled environment for inspiring new academic energy and innovative thinking. KVCC is a collegial environment emphasizing student success and respect for employees, students, and the community.

SALARY: Salary and benefits commensurate with the Agreement between the Maine Community College System Trustees and the MSEA Adjunct Faculty Bargaining Unit.

QUALIFICATIONS: An Associate's degree or equivalent professional experience with an interest in pursuing an advanced academic credential is required. Other combinations of professional licenses, certifications, education, and experience will be considered. Demonstrated professionalism and interpersonal skills in collaborating with colleagues and directing students are essential. A minimum of five (5) years of experience in the construction industry is required. A qualified applicant will have demonstrated experience in the design and/or installation of a various residential or commercial foundation systems; experience with timber frame construction and an understanding of sustainability principles in construction desired; relevant professional licenses and certifications desired.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Provide class instruction that covers the identification of the major components of a building's foundation, methods of installation, and an understanding of how buildings are secured to a foundation. Topics should include applied methods in both timber and stick framing as well as current best practices, especially from an environmental perspective. Hands-on training or demonstration will need to be tied into the curriculum as a three-week timeline will allow and is relevant to the overall course learning objectives. This is one three-week module (five hours per week) as part of the larger, five-module Building Envelope I course (other modules are Electrical, Plumbing, HVAC, and Welding). The course is part of the two-year Associate's degree Sustainable Construction program.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: Initial review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled.
