## **THE CAROLINE H. & DANA P. STURTEVANT SCHOLARSHIP**

The Caroline H. & Dana P. Sturtevant Scholarship Fund is a private fund established to foster further education

for a group of young people who have realized that higher education is necessary in order for them to reach their life goals. Awards will be made annually to students who have strength of character and educational potential, but may lack a traditional route, traditional test scores or high grade point averages. An applicant may have extenuating circumstances that have impeded his/her further education.

The number and amount of grants awarded will vary yearly and be determined by a grant review committee. Grants will apply to the second semester for students not yet matriculating. All students must successfully complete one semester of post secondary education prior to receipt of funds of the grant award.

### **CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBILITY:**

- ❑ Resident of Maine
- ❑ A graduating senior from a Maine high school or a holder of a Maine GED certificate or an adult ed diploma or has already graduated from a Maine high school
- ❑ Complete an application form
- ❑ Show evidence of academic and professional motivation as reflected in two letters of recommendation
- ❑ Submission by **April 25<sup>th</sup>** of the year in which the grant will be awarded

Financial need as calculated by Scholarship America must be demonstrated for the student to receive an award. All other criteria being equal, preference will be given first to associates, then to their children. Although Hannaford establishes the criteria, selection of recipients is made by Scholarship America. In no instance does any officer or associate of Hannaford or the Charitable Foundation play a part in the selection. Applicants will be notified in early May whether or not they have been selected to receive an award. Scholarship awards will be made in two equal installments, on August 15 and December 30, mailed to each recipient's home address, and made payable jointly to the student and the school, and must be endorsed by both.

# Maine Competitive Skills Scholarship

The Competitive Skills Scholarship Program enacted to provide access to post-secondary education for people at or below 200% of the poverty level so they can work in occupations that are well paid and in high demand.

In order to qualify for this scholarship, you must:

- Are least 18 years old; Legally eligible to work in US;
- Have income of less than 200% of the federal poverty level for the family size involved
  - Verify last 4 weeks of income
- Are applying for education or training for a job in a high wage high growth occupations;
- Do not have a marketable postsecondary degree;
- Have the aptitude to undertake and complete education or training as determined by the institution providing the education or training.

### Maine Innkeepers Association (MIA)

CODES: A/C/H, 22 [View Course of Study and Eligibility Codes\\*](#)

**Who is eligible to apply?** The Maine Innkeepers Association (MIA) administers two scholarship programs - one for Maine residents who wish to continue their education in the hospitality industry, and the other for students related to MIA members and students related to employees of MIA members. Scholarships for Maine residents are available to students who have been accepted to fully accredited schools with specialties in hotel administration and culinary sciences (e.g., Beal College, Southern Maine Technical College) and who are pursuing a career in the hotel and motel industry. Eligible students may be graduating high school seniors, the sons or daughters of an MIA member, or employees of MIA properties (including Allied Members) who have a grade point average of at least 2.5. Scholarships for Maine residents affiliated with MIA are available to (1) a member of the immediate family (owner/manager) whose property has been an active member of MIA for at least three consecutive years and whose dues are current; (2) a member of the immediate family (owner/manager) of a business of an allied member who has been a member of the MIA for at least three years and whose dues are current; and, (3) a student of person(s) who have been gainfully employed full-time for at least three years by an active member property or a business of an allied member and endorsed by the owner/manager.

**Scholarship amount:** Awards range from \$500 to \$1,000. While awards are not automatically renewable, students may apply for an award more than once.

**How are the scholarships awarded?** Awards are made based on scholastic record, financial need, employment history, extracurricular activities, and desire for a career in the hospitality industry.

**Application process:** Maine residents applying for a scholarship must submit an official high school transcript, two letters of reference from teachers or counselors, a letter of reference from a hotel or motel owner or proprietor, and an essay of no more than 500 words describing the student's affiliation with the hospitality industry, why the student is applying for this scholarship, and the student's career goals. Students who are affiliated with the Maine Innkeepers Association (MIA) must submit an official high school transcript, letters of acceptance from an institution(s) of higher education, two letters of reference from teachers or counselors and a third letter from the student's employer, and an essay of no more than 500 words describing why the student is applying for this scholarship, and the student's career goals. Also eligible are the spouses and children of those members of the armed forces on active duty who have been listed for more than 90 days as missing in action, captured, or forcibly detained or interned in the line of duty by a foreign government or power.

Additional eligibility factors are that (1) the veteran must have been a resident of Maine at the time of entry into service or have resided in the State for at least five years immediately preceding application for aid; and (2) in the case of children, they must be graduated from high school, be at least 16 years of age and not over 21 at the time of first entering a vocational school or an institution of higher education; or (3) if over 21 years of age upon entering a vocational school or institution of higher education, is not over 25 years of age and had been unable to enter before the age of 21 years due to service in the United States Armed Forces.

\*To be eligible, a spouse may not be divorced, and the widow or widower may not be remarried.

**Scholarship amount:** Amount awarded is tuition waiver to any State of Maine supported institution for higher learning.
